
The main session and topic this year was about CRISPR technology. This technology allows for genes to be edited to address an issue. In this instance, we were talking about removing a certain gene to make the pigs resistant to PRRS. PRRS has caused a lot of problems and heartaches in the swine industry for 30+ years. If a pig's genome can be edited so they don't have to suffer through or die from this virus that is a plus on the animal welfare and sustainability fronts. The panel discussion around gene editing included presentations about the technology, the process, transparency, and consideration of unintended consequences. It was a very robust conversation!

If you are in any way involved in the swine industry or want to learn more about this growing and vibrant industry, put July 16th, 2025, in York, NE on your calendar. We will be there for the 4th year and the sessions, conversations, and networking will be worth your time.
